

Bath-Brunswick AAUW Scholarship Data

University College at Bath/Brunswick

The AAUW Scholarship Program is a collaboration between the Bath-Brunswick Branch of the American Association of University Women (AAUW) and University College at Bath/Brunswick (UCBB). The program is intended for non-traditional female students who have been out of high school for at least one year and who wish to enroll or have already enrolled in the college. AAUW pays tuition and fees for one introductory level college course in either the fall or spring semesters. With a positive, stimulating course, it has been demonstrated that students move on into a more full-time college experience with a stronger commitment to furthering their education.

The deadline for the 2016-2017 Academic Year is March 31, 2016.

Scholarship Criteria

ELIGIBILITY

- highly motivated with stated financial need
- high school graduate or GED recipient
- at least one year between high school graduation and college matriculation

The packet shall consist of:

A one-page (single-spaced, 12 point font) introduction to include the following: name, address, phone number(s), date of birth, education (including date of high school diploma or GED), and answers to the following questions:

- 1. Why do you want to go to college?*
- 2. Describe your financial need.*
- 3. What are your hopes and goals for the future and how does a college education fit this vision?*
- 4. Why do you believe you will be successful?*
- 5. Include a letter of recommendation in your packet. This can be a letter from an employer, a pastor, a co-worker, or a former teacher.*

SELECTION PROCESS

Candidate selection is based on applicant's motivation, need, and potential for success. Acceptance decision will be made by a committee composed of AAUW members, UCBB Director, and UCBB Coordinator of Student Services. Applicant may be asked to meet with a representative of AAUW and a University College staff member.
